

Shakespeare Bulletin 2022 journal report

Journal management update

The general editor, Peter Kirwan, accepted a new position at Mary Baldwin University, beginning in September 2022, and a large part of the journal's administrative activity this year has involved the transfer of operations from the University of Nottingham to MBU. Thanks to sterling work by the admin team at MBU, by the editorial team, and with support of the Board, the journal not only continued its rate of production during this period, but also caught up with the existing backlog, meaning that the journal's publication schedule is, as of the end of 2022, up to date.

Journal personnel update

In early 2022, we conducted a search for a new book reviews editor to replace Sarah Dustagheer, and were pleased to welcome Elizabeth Zeman Kolkovich to the team.

This also marked a shift to an appointment and interview process for filling editorial roles. We received fourteen applications and interviewed four candidates.

Emily Mayne has been reappointed at Mary Baldwin University to continue in her role as editorial assistant. Katy Shinas, an MBU grad student, has been appointed as an editorial intern (funded by MBU) to begin working on the journal's social media presence.

Submissions and acceptance rate

During the twelve months between January and December 2022, the journal received approximately 17 submissions for stand-alone articles, 8 articles for a previously accepted special issue, and 2 special issue proposals.

Of these, 9 stand-alone articles, 8 special issue articles, and 2 special issue proposals went forward to peer review.

Of these, 3 articles, 7 special issue articles (covering volume 40, issues 3 and 4), and both special issue proposals (anticipated for volume 41, issues 1 and 2) were accepted for publication.

The peer review and editorial process at *Shakespeare Bulletin* aims to be both supportive and rigorous, and the journal has identified the need to increase submission rate as a priority for 2023. However, the current acceptance rate means that we have been able to publish approved articles very quickly, which our authors are appreciating.

Publication schedule

Volume 40 (which marks the journal's fortieth anniversary, marked with a new specially designed logo for the cover page) brings the journal's publication schedule up to date as of January 2023.
